"Don't let Delirium's better known cousin Dementia overshadow him on the ward" and


"Missed opportunity for skill sharing across Trauma & specialist dementia wards".

Progress: This is a hectic time for the PERFECTED Programme.

Work Package 1: The final data collection (interviews with patients and carers) is ongoing. Analysis of the focus groups and interviews with health professionals and commissioners are well underway.

Work Package 2: The initial Enhanced Recovery Pathway (ERP) is nearly constructed and we are looking forward to implementing Professor Fox's "ERP dream". Work Package 2 has an Action Research design and is due to start shortly. The ERP will be tried out in ward environments; it will then go through a process of development and refinement. The Service Improvement Leads (Emma Probitts, Emily Mulvaney, Kelly Goffin) have been appointed. We welcome them to the PERFECTED team and we very much look forward to working with them. Their induction takes place in late September.

Work Package 3: The protocol for this phase is under development.



Team Introductions- This month we learn more about <u>Dr Toby Smith</u> co-applicant on PERFECTED

Lecturer in Physiotherapy and the University of East Anglia, UK. Toby's clinical and research interests are predominantly based around the rehabilitation of people with lower limb (hip and knee) orthopaedic disorders, and the surgical management of these populations. His PhD was on the assessment and management

of people following first-time patellar dislocation. Current research areas include the rehabilitation of people following hip fracture surgery and the assessment and management of musculoskeletal diseases in older people, particularly in community settings. Toby has a particular focus on randomised controlled trials of complex interventions and research synthesis and the implementation of research into clinical practice.

Given this, Toby doesn't have much time out of work, but when he does, he enjoys running, cooking and is trying to learn the violin (unsuccessfully).
